Serving Others:

On Becoming a Resource Parent

“Congratulations, you have been approved as resource parents by COBYS Family Services.” These are encouraging words for the individuals, couples and families who choose to foster and adopt children through COBYS. But what does it really mean to be ‘approved’ and what will it take to be a successful resource family? The answer, many months of intensive screening and training and a whole lot of heart.

Anyone age twenty-one and up is eligible to be a resource parent. While many resource parents are in their late twenties and thirties, COBYS is pleased to also have parents who are older, some with older children or they are empty nesters. These experienced parents are often more comfortable having older children and/or sibling groups, two of the greatest needs, or children with trauma-related behaviors, placed in their home. The journey for hopeful resource parents to be approved, which generally takes at least six months, starts with a call or email to Senior Resource Home Coordinator Karen Rice. After

The process is long, uncomfortable and it is totally worth it.

Steps to Approval as a Resource Parent

1. Inquire with COBYS
2. Attend an Orientation Session
3. Complete the Resource Parent Application
4. Attend Pre-Service Training
5. Complete Home Safety Check
6. Complete any recommended therapy or meetings

expressing interest in fostering children, the first step is to attend an orientation session that covers the basics of the whole process. After that, it is on to the application.

The application to be resource parents covers everything from income history and personal references to medical and family history. People do not have to be wealthy to welcome children into their home, just financially stable. COBYS dives deep into personal background, because as a foster care agency entrusted with the safety of children, we want children to be placed in homes that are healthy and can remain so throughout the foster and adoption process. To this end, potential resource parents may be asked to attend therapy or receive other services, prior to any placements. According to Karen Rice, “what makes the most successful resource parents is openness to healing a family, being focused on the child’s need not their own needs, a good support system and a servant heart.”

During the approval process, resource parents specify the characteristics, such as age and gender, of children they want placed in their home. COBYS staff members encourage resource

I'd like to share a few things that have happened at COBYS recently:

A COBYS resource family received one on one consultations (through Zoom) to help them gain skills with specific challenging behaviors of children they were fostering. They decided to proceed with adoption for their two foster children due to the resources provided by COBYS. They said, "We are shocked with the amount of support we receive through COBYS. We know we have so much to learn but we are in this for the long haul." COBYS provides one-on-one consultations with other families as needed.

A young mother found a parenting class so helpful to her family that she even attended a session from the delivery room! So now, you can truly say that COBYS delivers! (And so did she!)

One of our resource families recently walked with their foster child as he learned that his birth mother died. The resource family had a wonderful connection to birth mom including picking her up to take her to baseball games with them since her son was playing. That bond allowed them to be able to connect in his grief and the family was with him at the funeral along with their COBYS caseworker.

The end of 2020 closed out COBYS fourth decade of services. We celebrated our 40 years of service at the banquet in March as well as in the past four newsletters. Above are a few, new short stories of what COBYS has done in the past months. I could have looked back and shared a number of other stories, as we have provided services for more than 61,564 people since our inception.

While we enjoyed looking back over the past 40 years, that isn't where our focus is. Our focus is on the next child that needs us to make sure they get the services they need, the next family that family that needs our support and compassion. That's not new. Motivated by our Christian faith, COBYS is committed to continuing our excellent service into the next decade. We hope you will go on the journey with us!

Over \$85,000 was donated to COBYS, going far beyond our goal for the day. We are humbled by the support and are so grateful for such confidence in our mission to educate, support and empower children and adults at risk in our community.



COBYS participated with more than 500 other nonprofits in Lancaster County's largest day of giving. This year over \$13.4 million was donated. Every dollar donated will be stretched with more than \$500,000 from the Community Foundation, Rodgers & Associates, The S. Dale High Family Foundation, and other community partners. The stretch fund is distributed proportionally to the amount each organization raises.

This year COBYS again joined our partners at Brethren Village to host giving stations in the lobby at the Wolfe Auditorium and in the Game Room at Fieldcrest.

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parents to be as broad as possible with their wishes, since the children needing care quite often do not match predetermined preferences. Families might initially prefer to foster only one young toddler, but who really needs their care is a sibling group of three preteen boys. The often-used phrase, *if you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans*, is certainly true when it comes to foster children. Foster care requires resource parents willing to step out of their comfort zone, to know as Rice says, "you are in this to serve others, not for your own glory."

1. Tolerance for Ambivalent Feelings
2. Firm & Authoritative Qualities
3. Flexible Expectations
4. Ability to Delay Parental Gratification
5. Sense of Humor
6. Ability to Meet Personal Needs
7. Ability to Use Resources
8. Know Their Own Family
9. Honor Child's Heritage
10. Faith

Hearing, "congratulations, you have been approved as resource parents," might be the end of a months-long approval process, but it is really just the beginning of a journey. Karen Rice is realistic with those who want to foster and adopt. She tells them, "Your heart is going to be broken, but there is a child and a family that needs someone to jump in and be willing to go through the process with them. It is long, uncomfortable and it is totally worth it."



Family Life Education



COBYS Family Life Education Unit successfully concluded the pilot Blues Program in early December. This six session cognitive-behavioral depression prevention intervention is for high schoolers with depressive symptoms and anxiety.

Although the program is for males and females, the pilot session held at Conestoga Valley was an all female group.


Participants and presenters agreed the sessions were very well received, and noticeable changes were achieved. Participants appreciated being in a group where others understood what they, themselves were going through.

Noticeable "weights were lifted" as life experience and coping techniques were shared.

Feedback from participants included this observation about what they thought were the good parts about the program: "Getting help and being given tools that help me be happy overall, and going to a safe space."

Many agreed that they hadn't realized that they could have positive thoughts even when some bad things were going on in their lives.

Winter sessions are planned in Ephrata and Elizabethtown.
