# Persistence pays off, part II



In my article for the newsletter last summer, I wrote about a bird who built her nest in the comfort of my front porch. I shared that the nest was about six feet off the ground and right next to the door so that every time I went out, I would scare Mrs. Bird (the name I have affectionately given her) and she would scare me. She would often leave the "evidence" of her fright on the bricks of my front porch. I, on the other hand, had a more controlled response to being startled.

Rarely do I get any feedback on my newsletter articles. But I did receive a few e-mails and letters about this one. A few shared similar stories of their experiences with birds. And a few gave some clever solutions to avoid this inconvenient situation. One of the solutions given was to place a ball in the area of the nest so there would be no room to build a nest. A simple solution, and one that I am embarrassed to say I didn't think of.

So this year, when Mrs. Bird returned and began building her nest, I got a red playground ball and placed it where Mrs. Bird was building. I was pleased! No more being scared and no more front porch messes! The very next day when I got home and was approaching the front door, I saw Mrs. Bird flying around, seemingly looking for a place to build her nest. It appeared to me that she was out of sorts (if that is possible with a bird).

I wondered if and when Mrs. Bird would find a place to build her nest. And not to sound braggadocios, but I wondered if there was any place better than my front porch to build her nest.

So as I watched Mrs. Bird flying around my front yard, I paused, grabbed the playground ball and went inside. My wife watched and smiled wryly as I walked past her and put the ball back in the garage, where it belongs. She knew Mrs. Bird had beaten me again. Mrs. Bird - 2, Mark - 0.

She is a worthy opponent. And one that will not have to worry about my interference next year.

The goal is to help children in foster care cope with their emotions and the uncertainty of the transitions on their journey. We added the title above because the poem supplies a snapshot of right now, with an eye to the future.

#### A Foster Child's Poem

I am the happy one, who likes to explore different things. I am the hyper, crazy one, who might want to do fun things 24/7.

I am the intelligent one, who would never put myself in a situation that would jeopardize my future.

I am the one with the scars and their secrets.

I am the messed up one, who thinks everybody lies.

I am the helpless one, who can't change what people do, say, or think.

I am the hurt one, but much more hurt on the inside.

I am the one with the scars, and their angry message is I'm tired of people's b\*\*\*s\*\*\*.
