Foster care really is meant to be temporary, with the goal of returning children to their biological family if possible, or adoption when that is not. Recently, Ashley Naque, senior adoption caseworker, and Megan Varga, adoption caseworker, provided child preparation services as four children were fortunate to begin to transition home to their biological parents. Preparing the children for the transition back home to their biological parents and infant sibling started while they were in their foster homes and continued as they transitioned home.

Even though the children had been involved with the child welfare system for several years, reunification was able to occur, not always the case with longer stays in foster care. Ashley and Megan worked together with the mutual goal of supporting the biological family as best they could.

Once the children had transitioned home, they met with the biological mother and children, developing a chore chart and house rules for the kids and helping mom establish structure and good routines from the start. Ashley made sure the mother had a good supply of incentive prizes from the dollar store and candy to help motivate the kids to complete chores and follow rules.

On the day of their final session,

COBYS was able to bless this family and these kids with everything they needed to go back-to-school. They were starting a new school, which meant they would have to make new friends, meet new teachers, and get used to a completely different school environment. Their mom shared their sizes with Ashley and Megan and described what shoes they had hoped for. The oldest girl wanted Puma high tops and the boys wanted Nikes. Through the use the COBYS Care Fund, Ashley and Megan were able to pay for their shoes and get one of the boys two pairs of pants from Target. Everything else, and Megan and Ashley stress, EVERYTHING else, they were able to get from the Kids' Closet.

They loaded up three backpacks with school supplies, found three lunch boxes, winter coats for all four children, t-shirts, long sleeve shirts, pants, shorts, sweatpants and toiletries. Ashley was working with the young girl who is not of school age and was able to find

clothes for her, a doll, coloring books and crayons as well. They could not leave the baby out so they found some winter clothes and pajamas, a feeding plate that sticks to a tray of a high chair, a sippy cup and a box of diapers.

Then they had the idea to include the

parents as well for a fresh start across the board. They found mom a coat, dad a sweatshirt and shirts, and both some sweatpants. Toiletries were added too. Plus each child received a Bible and a devotional for kids, that parents will be able to read with them.

We are so proud of the creativity, thoughtfulness and inclusivity demonstrated by these two exceptional caseworkers. Through generous gifts from our devoted supporters, they were "We are so thankful for the resources available at COBYS to bless this family as they adjust to being together again and starting school.

The Gift of Giving

Giving in time, talent and treasure is something you value, we know because you value the ministries of COBYS. But how did the need to give become

something you care about? Likely it was emphasized in your family, perhaps discussed or maybe demonstrated with acts of kindness. Of course, giving is a Biblical concept filled with many encouragements, such as 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. 




COBYS 2023-2024 Annual Report

At COBYS, our focus across the services we deliver continues to be trauma-informed care. To meet the increasingly complex needs of our children and youth in foster care, as well as those children, youth and adults in the wider community, our staff receive on-going training in best practices, allowing them to provide the COBYS Difference in care.

We need you to be a part of the solution. Beyond financial support, we need to grow the COBYS Community with new donors and new foster families, joining those who already know what valuable and needed ministries we provide. This report provides a snapshot of our care during the past fiscal year (July 1,2023 - June 30, 2024). Our 105 staff members are called to serve through delivery of our necessary, but sometimes messy and often heartbreaking care. We do all this in order that we might fulfill our mission, that motivated by Christian faith, we educate, support, and empower children and adults to reach their full potential.

Adoption. The COBYS

Adoption unit provides a range of services that assist children and families during the foster care process, in finalization of adoptions and in the life-long journey for families who have experienced adoption.

Our adoption staff work with some foster and adoptive families approved through COBYS, but also provide

services for many additional children, those placed in foster homes licensed through counties and those already adopted and in kinship placements. This wide range of services, facilitated by the Pennsylvania Statewide Adoption and Permanency Network (SWAN), are needed to address difficulties faced by children of all ages. The outcomes we see for children served by COBYS illustrate how beneficial the trauma-informed care we provide is to a child thriving.

The following units of service were provided:

- 18 child specific recruitments
- 60 child preparations
- 121 child profiles and addendums
- 28 family profiles
- 27 adoption finalizations
- 39 families assessed for post adoption services

To date 680 adoptions have been finalized by COBYS.

Foster Care. Our Foster Care team ensures that children are safe and supported while in care. COBYS foster families provide temporary care until a child can reunify with a birth parent or move to extended family. Foster families sometimes adopt a foster child if the court determines that the child cannot return home. Our Resource Home Specialists not only license foster families, but they also place children in our homes and provide unparalleled support. COBYS increased our recruitment efforts this year in response to local and national shortages of available foster families.

Foster Care statistics for the past year:

- 22,786 days of care to 166 children
- 84 children discharged, 30 to parents/other relatives
- 13 foster children in our care were adopted, while 41 were discharged to other places.
- 90 foster families served, 16 newly approved
- 81 children were placed from county referrals. COBYS contracts with 10 county agencies.
- All COBYS foster families have received evidence-based training in Trust-Based Relational Intervention (TBRI).
- COBYS foster families are diverse, including individuals and married couples ranging in age from 24 to 71.



Counseling. This past year, the Counseling department During the past year, Counseling provided and engaged in:

- 8,148 total counseling appointments
- 86 new clients served
- 99 successful discharges of clients. Successful discharge indicates that clients have reduced symptoms and are able to maintain stabilization.

Permanency. COBYS is contracted by the Lancaster County Children and Youth Social Service Agency to act as the county caseworker, working with parents and biological families on their court approved plans for reunification. We also assure the safety of children in their out-of-home placements. The program promotes a stronger and more stable family unit and helps families understand their needs and requirements. The goal is for families to reunify whenever safely possible.

This year was one of transition for Permanency with staff turnover. Despite the turnover, we worked diligently to continue to live out the COBYS mission providing excellent services to our clients. We have seen a large increase in the number of cases with both youth and adult clients struggling with severe mental health instability. We have several cases where the mental health deficits or cognitive limitations of the parents are so severe they are unable to safely parent their children. This is especially difficult for COBYS staff as there is no amount of services or support that can change client intellectual functioning to help them create a safe environment for their children. These cases often lead to the children being adopted or released to a legal guardian. However, the positive reunification cases give us hope and drive us to continue the work each day in what is a very difficult job.

This past year Permanency Unit staff walked alongside children and families, to these results:

- 143 children from 94 families served
- 17 children from 13 families were reunified
- 14 children from 11 families were transferred to adoption
- Family Life Education. This year we began

offering monthly Parenting Workshops through our Kinship programming that were meaningful to all caregivers. Some of the topics included: Intro to the IEP Journey, Helping Your Child Navigate School/Social Anxiety, Supporting the Mental Health of Child(ren) Under Your Care and Raising Children in a Digital World. This is a great opportunity for parents to explore and learn about current parenting challenges.

In both of our Incredible Years and Parenting Wisely programs individual sessions with an educator were added in addition to the group classes. These supports give families an opportunity to personalize their learning to address any challenges or struggles they are experiencing in their family.

Financial Support. Significant generosity in financial giving from donors to COBYS was evident again this past year. Beyond the services we provide, your financial gifts strengthen our staff; staff who advocate for clients and are known for not giving up when arranging care in the face of many challenges.

We continue to focus on guality, multi-channel communication with our donors, providing a variety of opportunities to connect to our ministries, from general giving to the COBYS Care Fund and even the Kids' Closet. We have also begun and will continue a more concerted effort to recruit foster families and new donors, working with a
