It is now official that COBYS has sold the "Old Mill" office at 1417 Oregon Road. The Business and Development departments now are in rental offices closer to 444 Murry Hill Circle, Lancaster where our foster care, adoption and family life education staff have been based for seven years.

The Counseling Center has moved and now sees clients at the Murry Hill Circle location.

Moving of offices aren't the only recent changes at COBYS. Our **Permanency Unit**, at our third location on E. King Street in downtown Lancaster, has been steadily restaffing to meet the needs of our partnership with Lancaster Children and Youth Services. These dedicated staff have quickly adopted the COBYS Difference in the way care is provided. This was evident in a recent, quickly arranged 5-hours trip to a neighboring state to bring back a runaway youth to give them a chance to start anew.



COBYS on the Move

There is a frequently quoted adage that claims "The only constant in life is change."

It's hard to argue against that observation. Change is inevitable in this everchanging, rapidly changing, world. COBYS Family Services is no stranger to change, having adjusted to the needs and requirements of providing high quality, compassionate care to those with whom we journey in their time of need.

The Family Life Education department has been moving forward too. COBYS is the North American "Trainer of Trainers" for the Blues Program, the evidence-based prevention program for teens with symptoms of anxiety, stress and depression. In the past year, the number of new trainers as grown almost 400% (training 292 Blues trainers), conducting 26 training classes which included people from 11 states and Canada and Mexico.

COBYS Resource Home Unit has significantly revamped the pre-service training process for foster and foster-to-adopt parents. The new training, which occurs prior to licensing, is a streamlined combination of training videos and mostly virtual, live sessions. These updates have eliminated redundancies, added more evidence-based instruction and personalization. The new training almost cuts in half the number of hours previously needed, while being more

advanced to help families deal with the issues they face. Additional training is a continual process for foster families throughout their time of fostering.


The trend we are encountering in the **Foster Care and Adoption** units is the increasing number of difficult cases. The trauma experienced by the clients our staff is serving is more pronounced in a field of work where the norm already starts with hard, messy situations. Yet these teams move forward with united efforts to work through the challenges and remarkably continue to do so with compassion and grace.

Clearly, COBYS has recently experienced an upswing of changes and challenges. And while change is inevitable, one constant is our mission to provide care and service to children, individuals and families who are dealing with real, often dire issues.

For COBYS, that commitment is as constant as change.

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An Act of Stewardship

I recently asked some friends what Biblical stewardship meant to them. The themes that emerged were centered around three words: ownership, responsibility and accountability.

Ownership as a theme quickly emerged. Ironically, it was not because we believed we own anything, but rather we agreed

that we own nothing! Everything we have belongs to God, we are only stewards of what He has created, we simply manage our "stuff" on His behalf (see Psalm 24:1). Through further discussion, we landed on the themes of responsibility and accountability. If we are stewards of all that God has entrusted to us, then we are responsible to manage it well because, one day, we will be called to give an account for how we managed it.



This conversation fits well into what has been occurring at COBYS. As you are aware, we recently went through some reorganization. Our Counseling Department moved into our Murry Hill Circle building and Business Operations moved into a smaller, leased space just down the road from the Murry Hill Circle location. The 1417 Oregon Road location was sold. The reason why these changes occurred was due to the Oregon Road location being significantly vacant throughout the week for a few years now. As hybrid work schedules allow for people to work remotely, the building

was not being fully utilized. Through prayerful consideration, we realized that we were not being good stewards of the resources provided to us by continuing to operate in a space that was significantly larger than what we needed. At every step, things fell easily into place; we could clearly see God's hand at work for our transition!

These organizational changes strengthen our delivery of services as consolidation allows for a greater level of collaboration among employees, which has always been a hallmark in the COBYS difference in care.

We appreciate your continued partnership and prayer as we steward to what God has provided us.
