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Good things (or blessings) come in threes

Terry and Becky Blimline had just been approved to be foster parents. On the third or fourth call from COBYS about a potential foster placement, they said "yes" to three siblings. This is not typical. But the Blimlines aren't your typical foster family - if there is such a thing.

In the "when you know, you know" department, Becky and Terry Blimline were married a short four months after meeting, (which included discussion about foster care on their first date). Into their third year of marriage, they began their foster to adopt journey with licensing and training from COBYS.

They were approved on Tuesday, April 18, 2023, and the children were in their home on Friday, April 21. Immediately going from a family of two to five and beginning to get to know one another became their plans for that weekend.

All three children (Joshua, 14; Tamsin 11; Victoria, 9), were comfortable in the home right from the start. Becky notes that, "They walked in like they owned the place." But, she also gushes that they are all amazing, smart, sweet and outgoing. Clearly, it turned out to be the right match.

The Blimline family grew together over the year and a half foster care journey with adoption being finalized on November 6, 2024. As is to be expected, during the children's time in care, it wasn't always smooth sailing. All "When we adopted them, the judge asked if they each wanted to testify and each one did and they did an amazing job! The kids are truly amazing! We are blessed to call them ours. "

foster children have lived experiences beyond their years, and the Blimlines are grateful for the support COBYS provided to address challenges. Services they received included trauma training and counseling as well as weekly meetings with

Landon Miller, their parent trainer. (They can't express enough the admiration they have for Landon and the benefits of having a parent trainer.)

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

- The strength of COBYS is our people. We have the best employees who wholeheartedly believe in our mission.
- Child welfare is a challenging business. We encounter children and families on what may be the worst day of their lives and are called to provide hope when things may seem hopeless.
- We absolutely cannot serve children and families without you. Your support is paramount to what we do. For example, our liability insurance costs have skyrocketed over the past few years. Without your dedicated support, we would have a major gap in our funding which impacts our ability to show others the love of Jesus.

We have also had some major achievements over the past year, among these are physical restructuring to ensure we are good stewards of the funds provided to us and the completion of our five-year strategic plan, which is available for you to view on our website.

While engaged in our work at COBYS, I often think of Matthew 25: 35-40,

when lesus talks of having all the nations gathered before Him. He references those on His right and invites them to inherit the Kingdom because of feeding Him, giving Him a drink, clothing Him and visiting Him. The righteous to whom he is speaking are confused by this and ask Jesus when they did such a thing. Jesus responds by telling them that when they did this to the least, they did it to Him. COBYS In Action (Things that did and could happen any day)

Makayla Malcolm, permanency case worker, has assisted a family with several children and both parents in prison. Despite the parents' actions and choices, they have a very loving and close relationship with their children. The children have had joyous visits with their mom in prison, despite the circumstances.

Recently, an incident happened during a visit that caused future visits to be suspended indefinitely. Makayla recognized that the reasoning provided by the prison did not match what she had seen while observing the visit. She spent time providing detailed information and advocating for

the prison to reconsider its decision. Makayla's advocacy paid off, with the prison realizing there had been an exaggeration of the issue and visits were able to resume. Makayla's willingness to push back and ask for reconsideration has ensured that these kids can continue to regularly visit their mom.



Becky Stutzman, senior permanency case worker, has worked with a very challenging parent for more than a year. Despite the lack of progress and very combative nature of this client, Becky has been a consistent source of support and has treated the client with kindness. Recently, this client was incarcerated, and Becky took time out of her day to visit, knowing that it was the first time the client was incarcerated.

The client later texted Becky and said, "Thank you for visiting me, I really appreciated that, and it really meant a lot to me, thank you so much!" Considering the incredibly difficult

nature of this client, this simple thank you is so significant and shows how kindness and showing up for our clients can make a huge difference.
